## Bórd Gáis Energy Crossbar Challenge

Newtownshandrum's Donagh Stack and Effin's Nicky Quaid couldn't be separated on Wednesday evening at the Gaelic Grounds in Limerick, as both went toe to toe in the Crossbar Challenge at half time during the Bord Gáis Energy Munster GAA Hurling U-21 Final. Donagh Stack stood up to the plate after witnessing his three predecessors all fail to hit the target, and the Corkman delivered by smacking the target on his third attempt. Next up was Limerick native Nicky Quaid who smashed the bar on his first go, receiving a massive roar from the home crowd. Following two near misses from the Effin clubman it was into a sudden death shootout.



With MC Mal Keaveney keeping the crowd involved, neither man could repeat their previous endeavours and the Bord Gáis Energy Crossbar Challenge was declared a draw keeping both sets of supporters happy. For their efforts, Donagh and Nicky were each presented with a prize of €250 worth of gear for their respective clubs, Newtownshandrum and Effin.

## Inter-County Hurling Tournaments

On Saturday the 27th of August Cork Inter-county Fe17, Fe16, Fe15 & Fe14 hurling teams are all in action. In total 175 players will be representing Cork at tournaments on the 27th.

The management teams of all the ages have put in enormous work and time into preparing the players for the tournaments and the players have also benefited from specialised coaches such as Charlie McCarthy, Jimmy Barry Murphy, Teddy McCarthy, Ronan Curran, Seanie McGrath, Donal Og Cusack, Joe Deane and Shane O'Neill doing individual session. The tournaments are at various venues in Munster, the Cork U17a are taking part in the Eugene Carey tournament in Mallow. Two U16 teams will be going to Tipperary. There will also be two Cork U15 teams playing on the 27<sup>th</sup>, one in Carrigdhoun and the other team playing in Clare. Finally two U14 teams will be heading to Waterford. ## County Board Report

The County Board meeting of August 16<sup>th</sup> heard reports from recent Inter-County teams, and it was confirmed that Brian Cuthbert did not wish to go forward as Minor Football manager. The Cathaoirleach expressed his thanks to all outgoing management teams. The appointments of the next Minor Football and U21 Hurling managers are to be discussed at the next meeting. Liam Hayes (Dromina) was appointed Intermediate Hurling Manager, with selectors to be announced.

Meanwhile, the Committee elected by the County Board to organise the appointment of the next Cork Senior Hurling manager will consist of three members of the Executive (to be announced) and the following club delegates: Pat Horgan - Midleton (Senior), Michael Byrne - Ballyhea (Intermediate) and John Corcoran - St. Mary's (Junior). It was hoped that a recommendation on the Minor Hurling manager would be available by the next meeting.

Fixtures were ratified and the Junior Football team for Saturday's All-Ireland Final was announced. The Cathaoirleach conveyed the best wishes of the meeting to all involved. The new proposals for the Allianz Leagues were discussed and would be voted on at the next Central Council meeting. The next meeting is on September 6<sup>th</sup>.



## Rebel Óg Fé14 Finals

A number of Rebel Óg/Coiste na nÓg Fé14 Finals were played recently, and congratulations to all finalists. In the 'A' final, Ahán Gaels beat Carraig na bhFear by the narrowest of margins, 2-8 to 2-7 at Carrigaline. The 'B' final, between Bride Rovers and Dromtarriffe, played at Glantane, ended in an exciting draw, Bride Rovers 4-9 Dromtarriffe 3-12, so these two sides will have to do it all again another day.
