U16 Hurling Championship

Valleys under 16 Hurlers had a good win over Shandrum (Newtownshandrum) last Friday evening in an excellently turned out pitch in Mallow considering the weather over the past few weeks. The game started lively with both sides level at 3 points each after ten minutes, one from Eoin O Reilly and two from Darragh Looney. At this point Valleys half back line and midfield took a firm grip of the game and dominated the next 20 minutes. Alan Murphy was completely in control at right half back winning every ball that came down that wing as was Chris O Leary who's distribution of the sliotar from centre back set up many a score on the night. Ian Crowley gave a superb performance during this period scoring two outstanding points demonstrating his skill and speed. Not to be outdone, his cousin Billy chipped in with two of his own from left corner forward. The movement of Gavin Hunt to centre forward and Tadgh O'Brien to full gave Valleys better balance down the middle and posed the Shandrum defence more problems. This dominance gave Valleys a 6 points lead at half time, 12 points to 6.

As expected after half time, Shandrum played with great determination and scored two points to reduce the margin to 4. With Ian Crowley's movement curtailed due to a nasty leg injury just before half time, Darragh Looney showed great leadership from the middle of the field for the remaining 20 minutes of the game contributing 9 points in total. His long range point scoring was outstanding and a ball delivered to Stephen O Shea who in turn set up Eoin O Reilly for a well taken goal put Valleys back in control of the game. The Valleys fullback line withstood some tremendous pressure over the last 10 minutes with Joe Bernard showing great confidence in goal and Donal McCarthy completely in charge at right corner back. Three well taken points by Eoin O Reilly, Gavin Hunt and Johnnie Kiely gave Valleys a deserved yet slightly flattering victory of 1.19 to 0.12.

Overall the victory was based on a very solid defence conceding no goals and dominant midfield play. The next round of the hurling Championship is against Charleville fixed for the 6th of August. Valleys were extremely lucky to beat Charleville by a point in the under 15 Championship last year so this game is going to be a extremely difficult. The football Championship now takes center stage for the next two weeks. Valleys got a bye in the first round so the quarter final has been fixed for July 30th against Wolf Tones/Kanturk. This was an excellent victory and well done to all involved.
