Premier 2 County hurling

The Valley Rovers U13 hurlers captured the Premier 2 County hurling title amidst great scenes of joy in Dungourney last weekend. Facing a Kiltha Og team who were unbeaten all year and playing them on their home patch, this was always going to be a battle royal. The game started with a bang with the Valleys scoring a great goal within five minutes. Back came Kiltha with three unanswered points leaving the teams level.

Again, the Valleys responded with two great points. Kiltha stormed back with a goal to lead by one. The Valleys were now under intense pressure. Two great long range frees had the Valleys back in front with half time approaching. With both teams exchanging some great points, the Valleys went in a point behind at half time, 1-7 to 1-8.

The second half started brightly for the Valleys with a great point to draw level (1-8 to 1-8). With ten minutes gone, and the Valleys looking the better team, the game turned with Kiltha Og scoring what some may say was a fortunate goal. Nevertheless, their tails were up and they began to take over. With the game entering the final quarter the Valleys to a man began to stand up and fight back. A cracker of a goal with five fabulous points had the Valleys back in the driving seat, leading by four. A goal by Kiltha Og heading into injury time had the lead down to a minimum. There is an old cliché: "cometh the hour cometh the man", which sums up the final three minutes of this match. Up a point with Kiltha Og throwing everything at us, including the kitchen sink, each player to a man rose to the challenge and put their bodies on the line. Heart, guts, the will to keep going when your body is telling you to stop, we had it all. The Valleys held on to win by one point on a score line of 2-14 to 3-10.

done everyone. Team:


