



- The GAA Injury Scheme covers club players, mentors and referees who are injured in the course of playing officially sanctioned matches, in club training sessions or whilst refereeing matches. Players, mentors and referees must be full club members to be covered by the GAA Injury Fund.
- Full details of the benefits and rules of the scheme can be found on www.gaa.ie
- All claims are handled and assessed by the loss adjuster, Willis, through the Club's Injury Claims Administrator.
- Willis must be notified of an injury within 60 days of the injury occurring. Notification consists of a minimum of the first two pages of the claim form being submitted to Willis. The form is submitted by the Injury Claims Administrator and should be with the Administrator within 50 days of the injury.
- Hurling claims will not be accepted if the injured player was not wearing an NSAI Standard IS 355 helmet at the time of the injury. Football claims will not be accepted if the injured player was not wearing a mouth-guard that carries the CE mark.
- For a claim to be accepted, the injury must be recorded in the referee's report.
- The Player Injury Scheme covers you for non-recoverable medical expenses. This means if a player has Private Health Insurance they must make a claim for their medical costs through their medical insurance provider in the first instance and a statement of account must be obtained.
- A statement of Account is a document supplied by your medical insurer outlining the medical receipts which they have received, the amount they have contributed and any shortfall.
- There is cover of up to €4500 for necessary medical/dental treatment. There is an excess of €100 per claim, which Lucan Sarsfields currently pays to the injured party. MRI Scans are limited to €300 per scan. There is no cover for pre-operative physiotherapy. If a player/mentor undergoes a surgical procedure there is cover for medically prescribed post-operative physiotherapy to €320 with a limit of €40 per session.
- Loss of wages claims are only applicable to those who are in full time employment (working a minimum of 16 hours per week) at the date of Injury. You must be unable to work for a minimum of 14 consecutive days.
