Head East on Mang Ave. towards Elmwood Ave. Turn Left onto Elmwood Ave. Drive 1.1 miles. The hospital will be on your left.

FIRST RESPONDER

In the event of an emergency call 911. The Kenmore Police Department is located across Elmwood Ave. from the park and will be the first on the scene. They will be able to secure an ambulance if necessary.

MEDICAL PLAN

There will be 1 certified athletic trainer that will arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to kick-off in order to tape and prepare the players for the game. Ice and water will be available on the home teams sideline. Tape will be provided by the ATC.

In case of an injury the procedure will be:

If injury occurs during warm ups the athlete or team representative should seek out the ATC for assistance. During the game, the ATC will conduct a primary on-field assessment. If the injury is not serious the ATC, with player assistance if needed, will bring the athlete to the sidelines and conduct a secondary assessment.

If the injury is serious the tournament ATC will ensure 911 is contacted and provide care until EMT's arrive. Together the ATC and EMT will inspect the athlete and determine if the ambulance is needed for transport to the hospital. The medical director will assist in organizing hospital transport for the athlete by private vehicle (with family or friend) if an ambulance ride is declined. All major treatment of injuries will be recorded in a medical report by the medical staff that administered treatment. The medical director will collect the reports at the end of each day of the game.

If there is a dispute over the medical care of an athlete this must be brought to the attention of the medical director and the incident will be recorded in writing. Situations such as this will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
