MEDICAL PLAN- There will be (2) EMTs , that will arrive no later than (30 mins) prior to kickoff for the first game. A fully operational AED will be provided by the team(s). Ice, water, tape will be provided at the medical station by the team.

Incase of injury during game or warm-ups and is serious EMTs will respond on field to assess and properly move injured player off field. This player's injuries will further be assessed by EMTs and course of action will be determined with cooperation from player, EMTs, Coaches, and Safety Officer(s).

If determined that player should have to go to hospital, player will be accompanied by designated safety officer along with coach or necessary assistance from team(s). The medical director will assist in organizing hospital transport for the athlete by private vehicle (with family or friend) if an ambulance ride is declined.

If injury is treatable i.e. bloody nose, injury shall be treated and player's eligibility to continue play shall be determined by safety officer and EMTs.

EMTs shall provide necessary care under NJ EMT scope of practice as stated in N.J.A.C. 8:40A-10.1

In the event that an injured player does not want to go to the hospital even under medical aids advisory player must sign a refusal of medical assistance (RMA). This RMA does not however prevent them from asking for medical assistance if player changes their mind or becomes unresponsive/ unable to make their own decisions.

A player will be transported to the hospital by an outside 911 agency (i.e. Cranford first aid) under the circumstances that they fall unconscious, combative, or are unable to make capable decisions due to but not limited to influences of drugs, alcohol, seizures, unresponsive and/or brain damage like symptoms. Under these circumstances a full incident report will be written. All efforts of EMTs will be provided while 911 is initiated.

If there is a dispute over the medical care of an athlete this must be brought to the attention of the medical director and the incident will be recorded in writing. Situations such as this will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
