From Randall's Island Fields 74 & 75: Head east on Wards Meadow Loop, turn right onto Hell Gate Circle, turn right onto Central Road. Use the right lane to go to Manhattan – merge on to the FDR Drive South and take exit 13 toward E 71 St. Turn right onto E 71st St, turn left onto York Ave, and turn left onto E 68th St.

### MEDICAL PLAN

There will be **one** (1) trainer for each field that will arrive no later than **a half hour prior to kick off** in order to tape and prepare the players for the first game. Ice, water, and tape will be provided at the designated medical area.

#### *In case of an injury the procedure will be:*

If injury occurs during warm ups or outside of a schedule game the athlete should report to the designated medical area for assistance. The ATC will conduct a primary on-field assessment. If the injury is not serious the ATC will bring the athlete to the sidelines and conduct a secondary assessment.

If the injury is serious the tournament ATC will take the field and assist. The ATC will inspect the athlete and determine if an ambulance is needed for transport to the hospital. The medical director will assist in organizing hospital transport for the athlete by private vehicle (with family or friend) if an ambulance ride is declined. All major treatment of injuries will be recorded in a medical report by the medical staff that administered treatment. The medical director will collect the reports at the end of each day of competition.

If there is a dispute over the medical care of an athlete this must be brought to the attention of the medical director and the incident will be recorded in writing. Situations such as this will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
